All that changed when she started complaining of a headache and went unconscious. It was later found that Hallie had a blood clot and brain hemorrhage.

After undergoing many life-saving surgeries, she was in, as her mother describes it, “a very debilitated state. She was lethargic and as weak as a newborn.” Hallie began speech therapy at Easter Seals Central Alabama, shortly thereafter.

Fast forward to summer 2016. ESCA was the recipient of a generous handicapped-accessible van from an anonymous donor. The person wished the van to go to somebody in need. Hallie was the obvious choice. Her mother had been trying to physically load her and her chair into an old car. 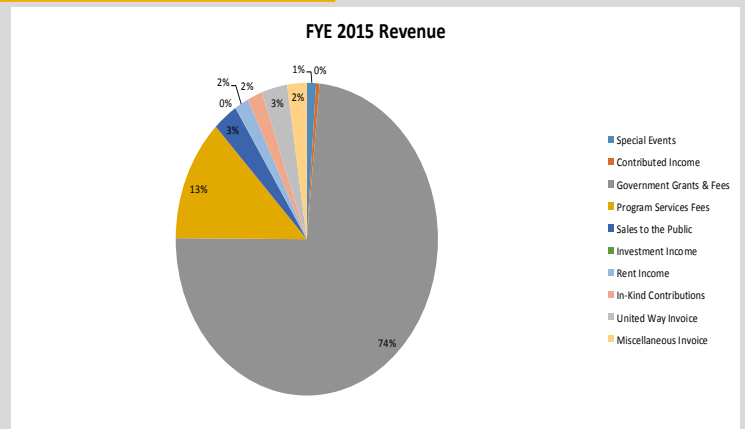

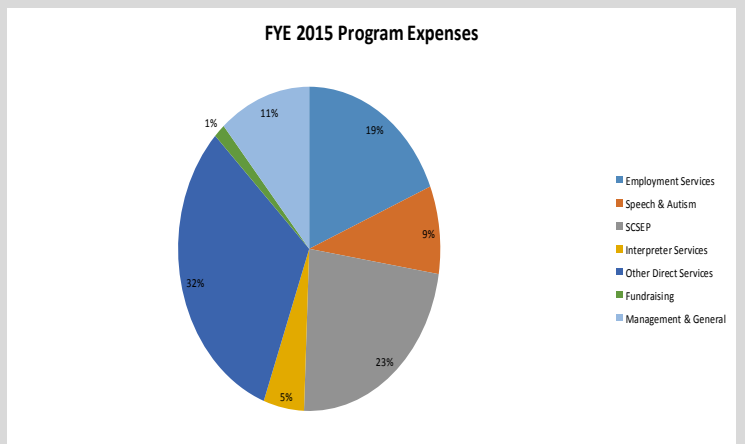
